The Placement of our Hearts – We Get to Choose

Matthew 6:19-24/Luke 12:22-34

<u>Matthew</u> ¹⁹ "<u>Do not store up</u> for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your <u>heart</u> will be also.

²² "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are healthy, your whole body will be full of light. ²³ But if your eyes are unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness!

²⁴ "No one can **serve** two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot **serve** both God and money.

<u>Luke</u>²² Then Jesus said to his disciples: "Therefore I tell you, <u>do not worry</u> about your life, what you will eat; or about your body, what you will wear. ²³ For life is more than food, and the body more than clothes. ²⁴ Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds! ²⁵ Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life. ²⁶ Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest?

²⁷ "Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. ²⁸ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, how much more will he clothe you—you of little faith! ²⁹ And do not set your heart on what you will eat or drink; do not worry about it. ³⁰ For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹ But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.

³² "<u>Do not be afraid</u>, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. ³³ Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. ³⁴ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Memory Verse: Matthew 6:21

"For where your treasure is, there your **heart** will be also."

Q: What are the themes of these scripture portions?

- 1. Action verbs we get to choose how we live
- 2. Content nouns we get to choose who we are (the contents of our heart/core/person)
- 3. The guestion: How then should we live in the world?

PLACEMENT VERBS (where we place, locate our hearts, our inner self, our core person)

Negative – to be avoided – do not store up; do not worry; do not set; do not be afraid Positive – to be embraced – store up; consider; seek; sell; give; provide

CONTENT NOUNS (what we fill our hearts with, our inner self, our core person)

Negative – to be avoided (not to be our focus) – treasures on earth; money; food; clothes Positive – to be embraced – treasures in heaven; God's kingdom (here and now and in heaven)

Treasures

Treasure - noun = theasauros = place where something is kept, usually something of great value Store up - verb = thesaurizo = to store up, to save, to treasure

Question: How then should we live in the world? Two equally important mandates:

- (1) "Sell your possessions and give to the poor.
- (2) "Provide purses for yourselves that will never wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail,..."

So what does this all mean:

- For our own lives? (**provide** spiritual treasure, now and in heaven)
- As we relate to the world around us? (**sell, give** fleshing out the Gospel in the world)
- What in these teachings of Jesus appeals to those who don't know Him?

Here's the conclusion of the matter: ²⁴ "No one can **serve** two masters."

"You're gonna have to **serve** somebody, yes indeed, you're gonna have to **serve** somebody Well, it may be the devil or it may be the Lord, but you're gonna have to **serve** somebody."

"'Where thy heart is, there shall thy treasure be also.' Our treasure may of course be small and inconspicuous, but its size is immaterial; it all depends on the heart, on ourselves.
